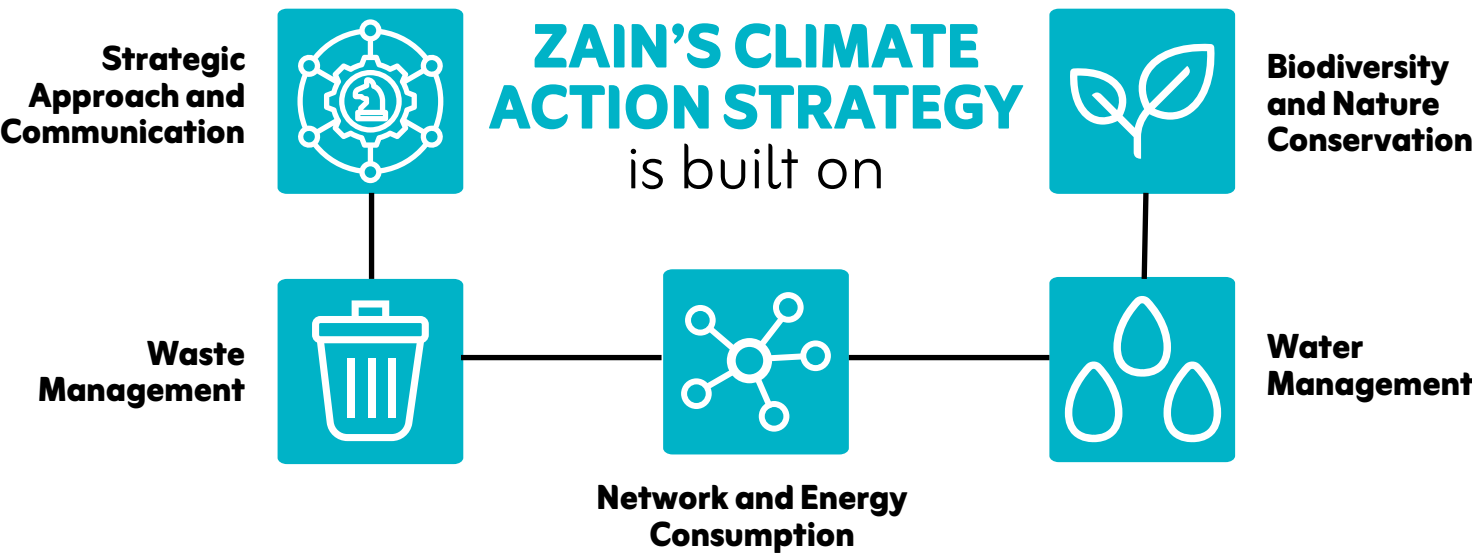


CLIMATE CHANGE

Zain Group implemented its Waste Management Compliance Framework with the goal of eliminating all forms of waste, including e-waste, plastic waste, wood and paper waste by 2030.

Zain Kuwait continued to advance its sustainability agenda through a range of waste management initiatives, supported by its ongoing partnership with TadwiRe, Kuwait's first recycling facility of its kind.

ZAIN BAHRAIN

Zain Bahrain continues to eliminate waste across its headquarters, the company instituted a paper-reduction initiative designed to minimize paper consumption and enhance operational efficiency. Since inception, over 38,000 kg of paper have been collected, including 100kg in 2025.

Operating in a water scarce region, Zain prioritizes its water consumption across its markets.
